PAVING:

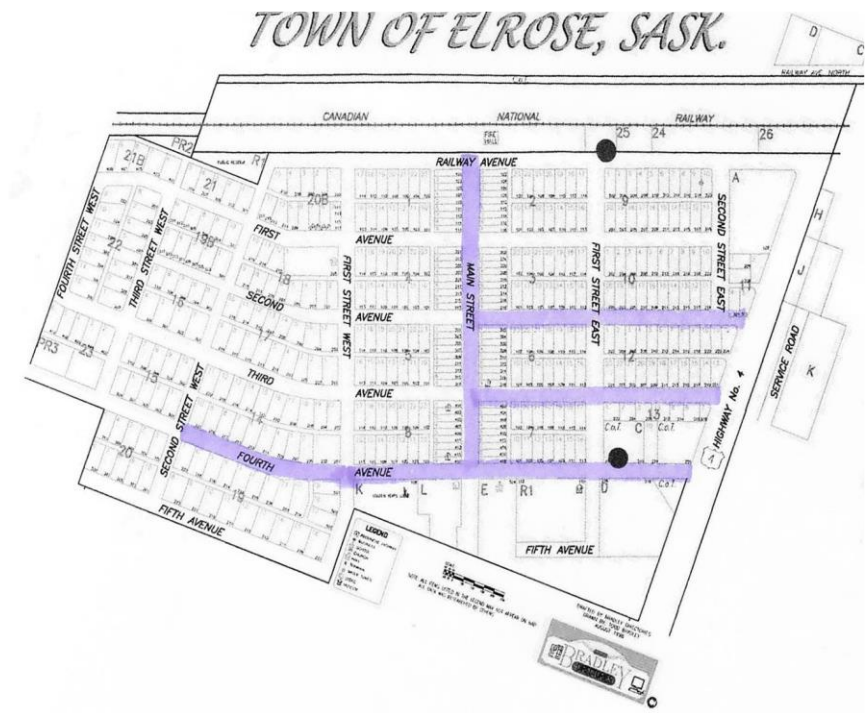
Starting in July the following streets will be paved:

Council members are entrusted to make decisions that directly affect the daily lives of residents, families, local business owners and others in the community.

Have you considered running for Town Council?

This FAQ sheet will give you some information on the process and how you can become involved in your community.

October 9, 2024 is the date that nominations forms need to be received.

Municipal Elections will on November 13, 2024. Mayor and Council seats will be available for nominations.

The Ministry of Government Relations, in consultation with the municipal associations (Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities, Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association, Urban Municipal Administrators Association of Saskatchewan and Rural Municipal Administrators' Association), developed the following resources geared toward citizens who are thinking about running for municipal council:

DID YOU KNOW?

- A property owner/home owner is responsible for maintaining the property they own whether they live there or not.
- If you have a vacant property, it must also be maintained.
- If you own a rental property the onus falls on the owner to ensure the property is properly maintained.
- Any boulevard or back lane area maintenance is the responsibility of the property owner.
- Any concerns over the Rural Doctor situation should be relayed to our MLA Jim Reiter and the Minister of Health Paul Merriman.
- Sask Energy lines have been installed in the New Subdivision.
- SaskTel will be in the area this summer to install infiNET to Elrose. They will be updating the lines and there will be minimal impact to the customers' property as all work done overhead.
- **Gravel & Dirt pile that is located at the Compost Pile is the property of the Town of Elrose. Please do not help yourself to the piles. You need to order the products through the Town Office.** A camera has been installed at the site, as this continues to be an issue.

Reminders:

- The Homecoming committee will be placing lawn signs in front of properties next July with a historic timeline of the location and who has lived/is living in homes. If anyone would like to opt out of the sign program, please let the Town Office or Committee member know, otherwise a sign will be planned to be placed in front of your property. In addition, if you have history on your property that you would like to share, please let us know.
- Reminder to Home Owners: branches from trees on the boulevard are the responsibility of the homeowner. Please plan to have branches removed from your property. If you are unable to remove them yourself then you will need to contact a friend or neighbor to have them removed and have them taken to the Transfer Station.
- BINGO is starting up again at the Elrose Museum, every Wednesday at 7:00pm (doors open at 6:30pm) from May 1st to October 30th. Snacks available for purchase. Everyone welcome!!
- Sask Landing Regional Water Pipeline Utility is celebrating their 10th Anniversary on July 10, 2024. Join them for a BBQ @ North Water Treatment Plant (Elrose) 10:30 am to 12:30 pm.

SaskEnergy, and its subsidiary TransGas, take pride in providing safe and reliable service to our customers. Every year, as part of our enhanced safety and gas line integrity program, we routinely perform a variety of safety tests and inspections throughout different areas of the province. This includes surveying for natural gas leaks and visual inspections of utility right-of-ways.

To inspect our gas lines, we may utilize a variety of techniques that can include both vehicle-mounted equipment and hand-held devices. These highly sensitive instruments are designed to detect natural gas and will be used to survey above and below ground infrastructure. In the event that a natural gas leak is detected or other repairs to the system need to be made, SaskEnergy personnel will respond accordingly. Inspection of the gas line system will take place in your area between **June 6 – July 6, 2024**. This will be completed by a SaskEnergy or a qualified Field Representative who has been contracted to complete this work on our behalf. Field Representatives will wear hi-visibility clothing, travel in marked vehicles, and will carry identification indicating they work for or on behalf of SaskEnergy.

Please note that residents will not be notified prior to the specific inspection date. There is no action required by the home / landowner, and no direct contact needed during the inspection. While surveys are an integral part of SaskEnergy's annual safety program, all natural gas in SaskEnergy's distribution system is odourized as an additional safety feature. If you suspect the smell of natural gas, please call SaskEnergy's 24-hour emergency service line immediately at **1-888-7000-GAS (427)**.
