Water Rate Increase

The Sask Landing Regional Water Pipeline Utility has received approval from the Saskatchewan Municipal Board and will be increasing the water rates for the Town by \$4.00 per 1000 gallon effective June 1st. Therefore, the Town of Elrose will be required to seek the same approval from the Saskatchewan Municipal Board. If approved, the increase will come into effect on your Town of Elrose June utility bill. Detailed explanation of the new rates will be enclosed with your bill.

Plastic Containers, Milk Cartons & Plastic Milk Jugs, Shrink Wrap & Plastic Bags- Plastics numbered 1 through 7

No oil containers or chemical jugs (Please check the bottom of containers for this symbol and number)
